Applicants Eligibility

Applicants need to:

_	hold qualifying property, which can be purchased or rented;
_	if purchased, the property value must be a minimum of EUR3750,000 for a property situated in Malta;
_	if rented, the lease value must be for a minimum of EUR14,000 per year for a property situated in Malta;
_	make a Government Contribution – If a property is purchased, the contribution will be EUR30,000, (EUR60,000 if leasing a property), plus EUR10,000 for every parent or grandparent of the principal applicant except the spouse;
_	make a donation of EUR2,000 to a local philanthropic, cultural, scientific, artistic, sport or animal welfare NGO registered with the Commissioner of Voluntary Organisations;
_	hold the qualifying property for a minimum period of 5 years;
_	pay an administrative fee of EUR50,000 per application;

be in possession of a valid travel document;

take out a sickness insurance policy to cover all risks across Malta;

take out a travel insurance when travelling across Schengen.

Who Can Apply for MPRP Regulations

This Programme is only open to TCNs. TCNs are individuals who are not citizens of the European Union, EEA (European Economic Area) nationals nor Swiss nationals.

Applicants should be economically self-sufficient and be fit and proper individuals.

Applicants should have assets having a value of not less than EUR500,000 out of which a minimum of EUR150,000 shall be in the form of financial assets or having a value of not less than EUR650,000, out of which a minimum of EUR75,000 shall be in the form of financial assets.
